Grant County District #2 Employee Receives Roads Scholar Certificate

Jason Kilian Arthur Jones, Operator, Grant County District #2, recently received a Certificate of Completion of the Roads Scholar Program offered through the Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP), an extension program of the College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology at Oklahoma State University. Certificates were presented on July 31, 2019 at the Association of County Commissioners (ACCO) Conference in Norman, Oklahoma.

Jason Arthur qualified for the Roads Scholar certification, which includes County Commissioners, county road employees, tribal transportation department employees, municipal road personnel, and local governmental employees in related fields.

The Roads Scholar Program, which began in Oklahoma in 1993, is an educational series designed specifically for County Commissioners, County Road Foremen, City Public Works Officials, Tribal Officials, and the employees of public agencies responsible for transportation infrastructure.

The program's purpose is to provide these individuals with a basic education in the civil engineering-related and other technical aspects of their jobs. It consists of eight courses, totaling 112 hours, which relate to road and bridge maintenance, construction, and repair. These courses include Aggregate Road Maintenance, Excavation Safety, Testing for Soil Properties, MUTCD Part 6, Surveying, Traffic Incident Management Basics, Project Management, and Plan Reading.
