Voter Registration Deadline is February 7, 2020

Wednesday the 7th is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the March 3 Presidential Preferential Primary Election, Election Board Secretary Robyn Rapp said today.

Rapp said that persons who are United States citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 18 years old may apply to become registered voters.

Persons who have never been registered to vote before or who are not currently registered in the county of their residence may apply by filling out and mailing an Oklahoma voter Registration Application form in time for it to be postmarked no later than midnight Wednesday February 7.

Rapp explained that applications postmarked after that time still will be accepted and processed; however, that applications will not be approved until after March 3.

The County Election Board responds to every person who applies for voter's registration. The response is either a voter's identification card listing the new voter's precinct number and polling place location or a letter that explains the reason or reasons that application for voter's registration was not approved. Rapp said that any person who has submitted a voter's registration application and who has not received a response within 30 days should contact the county Election Board office.

Oklahoma Voter's Registration Application forms are available at the County Election Board office located at 112 E. Guthrie, on the 3rd floor, also at most post offices, tag agencies, public libraries and available at www.elections.ok.gov.
